Bale Daja at Komaneka at Tanggayudha

Dawn sees Bali's lush rain forest at its most beautiful. Mist rises above the trees and settles in the deep valleys, radiating from the towering Batukaru Mountain at the island's heart.

The best way to enjoy this spectacle is to settle in a villa high enough to see the whole view over the Oos River, the mountain and the forest surrounding it.

Bale Daja, which in Balinese means "guest pavilion", is a two-story villa found in a secluded, rainforest location. It has traditional Balinese architecture and philosophy all over the villa.

It is open yet secluded, creating intimacy without feeling restrained.

Settle in the upper bedroom of Bale Daja and you will have the most romantic view of Ubud's rainforest.
